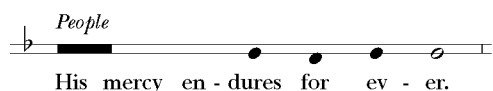
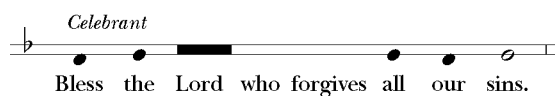

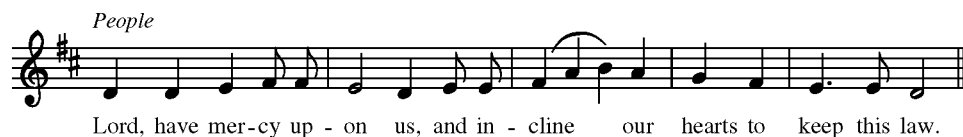

**The Lesson**

Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

The word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." ## The Epistle

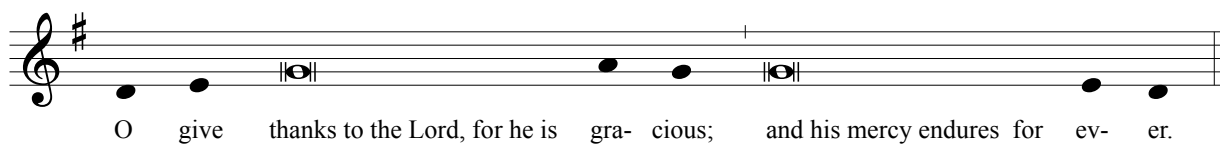
Philippians 3:17–4:1

## The Nicene Creed

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.
